## PLAYING DAYS AND FORMATS

### SUNDAY

Lawns are available for practice and matches.

Where matches are booked, one lawn must be kept free for practice.

First Sunday in the month 'Come and Try' session for the public (1-3pm)

### MONDAY & FRIDAY

Morning: No play - lawn maintenance.

Afternoon: Lawns available for practice and matches.

### TUESDAY - THURSDAY

Morning: Organised draw for all players.

### TUESDAYS & SUNDAY (PM)

Afternoon: Hi-Rollers (handicaps 16 or more).

### SATURDAY

Morning: All players. Usually doubles - dependent on numbers.

Afternoon: All players; focus on high-low doubles. Special draws on first Saturday of the month (plus BYO everything BBQ).

**Weekday public holidays** - same as Saturday, except for special events/trophy competitions.

The Club Captain and/or Vice Captain will arrange the draw. In their absence it will be arranged by a member of the Biskeing and Playing Committee, or if not present, the most senior available player. Guidelines for conducting the draw are available.

Scheduled Club draws have absolute priority over any privately organised matches (competition or otherwise) unless sanctioned by the Bisqueing & Playing Committee. If a privately organised match is under way and the lawn required for general play, that match should be pegged down and continued later. There is no problem with playing a competition match during a Club draw provided that match does not in any way interfere or disadvantage players taking part in the draw.

Double-banked games will be played under the current ACA rules.

The automatic watering system nozzles constitute "special damage" under *Law 23(b)*.

Note: The ball should be moved to a position where the nozzle cannot be damaged by either the mallet or ball(s) in the next stroke, but not to the advantage of the striker.

Dress to be according to Club uniform regulations. Flat-soled shoes **MUST** be worn at all times. Club uniform must be worn on playing days and when playing matches.
