### SUNDAY

- Courts are available for practice and matches
- Where matches are booked, one court must be kept free for practice
- First Sunday in the month 'Come and Try' session for the public (1-3pm) – all three courts
- High-Rollers is a special restricted Association Croquet draw for handicaps 16 and higher

### MONDAY & FRIDAY

- Morning: No play - lawn maintenance
- Afternoon: Courts available for practice and matches

### TUESDAY - THURSDAY

- Organised draws for all players

### SATURDAY

- Morning: All players. May be doubles - dependent on numbers  
Afternoon: All players; focus on high-low doubles; special draws on second Saturday of the month (plus BYO everything BBQ).

**Weekday public holidays** - same as Saturday, except for special events/trophy competitions

## **DRAWS**

The Club Captain and/or Vice Captain will arrange the draw. In their absence it will be arranged by a member of the Playing Committee, or if not present, the most senior available player. Guidelines for conducting the draw are available.

Scheduled Club draws have absolute priority over any privately organised matches (competition or otherwise) unless sanctioned by the Playing Committee. If a privately organised match is under way and the court required for general play, that match should be pegged down and continued later. There is no problem with playing a competition match during a Club draw provided that match does not in any way interfere or disadvantage players taking part in the draw.

Double-banked games will be conducted under current Laws (Association Croquet Law 52; Golf Croquet Rule 9).

The automatic watering system nozzles constitute "special damage" (Association Croquet Law 34(c); Golf Croquet Rule 9(b)).

Note: The ball should be moved to a position where the nozzle cannot be damaged by either the mallet or ball(s) in the next stroke, but not to the advantage of the striker.

Dress to be according to Club uniform regulations. Flat-soled shoes **MUST** be worn at all times.
