TROPHY COMPETITIONS

Only financial members of the Canberra Croquet Club are eligible to enter the competitions below unless specified differently.

ASSOCIATION CROQUET

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

1. An Association Croquet advanced singles competition, open to all members on a handicap of 8 or under. Minimum number of entries is 4.
2. Games are 2½ hours.
3. The Championship is to be played as a round-robin, with one or two blocks, depending on the number of entrants. If there are two blocks, the winner of each block is to play the runner-up in the other block to qualify for the final. If a single block, first and second to play a final.
4. Block games are single, but semi-finals and final are to be the best of three games.
5. Players must be available to play all round-robin matches, semi-finals and the final by dates announced when entries open. These dates will be chosen after consideration of NSW and National Championship event dates.
6. The Club pays the Club Champion's entry fee to the NSW Champion of Champions event.
7. Hoops will be set as close as possible to 3 11/16th inches inside measurement at half ball height with an allowed tolerance of +/- 1/32 inch.
8. ACA Handicap cards will be used.

AWARDS:	Club Champion	The Lily Barrenger Memorial Cup and two glasses Name placed on Honour board Club Medallion.

HANDICAP DOUBLES

1. An Association Croquet handicap doubles competition open to all members on a handicap of 20 or under.
2. Partners are randomly drawn, seniors with juniors.
3. Knock-out format.
4. Games are 2½ hours.
5. Minimum number of entries 8.

AWARDS:	Winners	Burgmann Tray and one glass each
	Runners-up	One glass each

WOMEN'S OPEN SINGLES

1. An Association Croquet advanced singles competition for women players. Any player not a member of Canberra Croquet Club (CCC) cannot take the title of Women's Open Singles winner. The title will then be awarded to the leading CCC player in the competition. Non CCC players will be charged a \$25 entry fee.
2. Played as a round-robin.

GOLF CROQUET

Common Regulations for all Golf Croquet Tournaments

1. To be played under the current Rules of Golf Croquet approved by the World Croquet Federation and adopted by Croquet Australia.
2. Games are un-timed best of 13 points.
3. ACA Handicap cards will be used for singles tournaments.
4. Dawson International balls will be used.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

1. Open to all members.
2. Minimum number of entries is 4.
3. The Championship is played as a round-robin, with one or two blocks, depending on the number of entrants. If two blocks, the winner of each block will play the runner-up in the other block to qualify for the final. If a single block, first and second play a final. Blocks will be seeded.
4. Block matches are single games; semi-finals and final are best of three games.
5. Players must be available to play all round-robin matches, semi-finals and the final by any dates announced when entries open. These dates will be chosen after consideration of NSW and National Championship event dates.
6. The Club will pay the Club Champion's entry fee to the NSW Champion of Golf Champions event should such an event be established.
7. Hoops will be set at a width of 3 11/16th inches with an upward tolerance of 1/32nd of an inch in terms of Rule 3(a).

1. A Golf Croquet handicap doubles competition open to all members.
2. Partners are randomly drawn, seniors with juniors.
3. Knock-out format.
4. Minimum number of entries 8.

AWARDS:	Winners	Trophy One glass each
	Runners-up	One glass each

HANDICAP SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIP

1. A Golf Croquet handicap singles competition open to all members.
2. To be played as a round-robin, with one or more blocks, depending on the number of entrants. If two blocks, the winner of each block will play the runner-up in the other block to qualify for the final. If a single block, first and second to play a final.
3. Minimum number of entries 4.
4. Block matches are single, but semi-finals and final are to be the best of three games.

AWARDS:	Winner	One glass Name placed on Honour board
	Runner-up	One glass

GATEBALL

GATEBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. A doubles Gateball competition open to all members of the club.
2. Minimum number of entries 4.
3. Round-robin, with one or more block draws depending on the number of entrants. If there is more than one block, semi-finals and a final will be played.

AWARDS:	Winners	The Tavender Trophy and one glass each
	Runners-up	One glass each

MISCELLANEOUS

AMY WEST ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD

This award is decided by the Club Captain each year and presented to the member considered by the Captain to have made a major contribution to the Club while also working hard to improve their standard of play.

1. Two matches are to be played annually against the Queanbeyan Croquet Club, one match at each Club.
