## President's Report

This report has been structured against the Club's Strategic Plan and incorporates contributions from the Captain, the Treasurer and other office bearers.

The 2011-2012 year has been one of consolidation after the flurry of projects which happened last year. Our membership has increased and significant effort has been put into nurturing our new members.

### *Recruitment and Retention Membership*

The club membership currently stands at 96 (41 females and 55 males) with 25 new members joining the club during the year. This is a net increase of 11 members over 2010-11 figures despite a significant number (15) of resignations. We are also holding four applications for membership to take effect in 2012-13, bringing actual membership for the start of the next year to 100.

However it should be noted that 11 new members are from the Australian Command and Staff College and since only a few of those members will be based in Canberra next year we cannot expect to retain many of their memberships in the immediate future. There are nine Associate members. Although the number of resignations may seem high this year, in fact several were from people who retired from age or ill health and others from people who had joined, never played but had paid fees for some years.

Of the players for whom the information was available, the majority of players remain as Association Croquet Players (just over 50), with Golf Association players numbering in the mid 30s and about 17 Gateball players. Of course, there are a number of people playing in two if not three of these games.

The Committee is confident that the new joining rules introduced last year has positively influenced the number of new people. We now try to deliver Come and Try on demand to capture people while their interest is high, deduct the cost of beginner training from the first year's membership and encourage people taking lessons to join the Club once they are deemed competent to play a social game of Golf Croquet. The vast majority of people who elect to join the Club after one or two lessons finished all

six lessons. A significant number are playing in the social Association Croquet draws and a few have the potential to become very good very quickly.

Therefore it is pleasing to note that this year, the numbers playing Association Croquet in the week day social draws have increased significantly and that a high proportion of players are those who have been playing for 12 months or less. High Rollers has continued during the year under stewardship of Hilary White and the offer of a Croquet Kindy approach has been taken up by several brand new players. Under this process, pairs are given individual support of a 15 minutes skills session followed by a highly supervised game. It seems to be working well and improving the players' confidence to join regular draws.

The numbers playing social Association Croquet on the weekend seems relatively static but the numbers playing Golf Croquet on Saturday afternoons has increased to regularly needing two courts.

Gateball numbers have fallen slightly as members and partners enter their child rearing phase of life while another pair of players will leave in 2013 to live interstate.

### *Coaches and Referees*

The Captain reports that we have eight Association Referees, one Association Examining Referee, four Golf croquet referees and no Golf Croquet Examining Referees. Within Gateball we have six referees.

Five people have qualified as Association Beginner Coaches and two hold qualifications as Level 2 Coaches. There are two qualified Golf Croquet coaches.

There was a flurry of activity to qualify Beginner Association coaches for insurance purposes in recent years. However, the ACA has now advised that this is not a necessary qualification for conducting beginner training, hirings etc.

The Captain notes however, that with the new regulations promulgated by Croquet NSW, it will be difficult for a coach/referee outside Sydney to maintain their status as an active coach/referee. He reports that most of the senior players with whom he has discussed these rules intend to let their status lapse. This will have serious impact for our Club and will need to be addressed by the incoming Committee.

### *Introductory Coaching*

The Club ran five initial training courses for 28 people of whom 24 became members. These courses were run by Ben Freasier, Bob Gingold, Rodney Teakle, Peter Freer and Hilary White. The translation from initial training to membership is pleasing.

### *Come and Try Association and Golf Croquet*

As foreshadowed in last year's Annual Report, the committee gave consideration to the traditional Come and Try approach. It has continued to be offered but after some discussion and training with the National Coaching Coordinator, the format was altered to provide the basic of Golf Croquet and a demonstration of Association Croquet for those who show interest. About 79 people passed through a total of nine sessions, mostly run by John Harris but also Rodney Teakle, Ben Freasier, Peter Freer, John Grattan and Hilary White.

The other approach of offering Come and Try on demand has been addressed elsewhere in this report.

### *Player Development*

No formal player development was offered this year because a primary focus was on the provision of beginner training. Introducing 25 new people to the sport has been demanding on the number of available coaches.

### *Event Management*

The Club held its two major Association Croquet tournaments, the Canberra Open and the Easter Carnival. Numbers were down a little for the Canberra Open because of the absence of some regular players from illness but it was, as usual, calmly and competently managed by Stephen Richards. We thank Stephen, as we do Peter Freer who cheerfully managed the Easter Carnival without a hitch.

The Tony Hall Cup was introduced as a high/low doubles Golf Croquet competition, to provide some parity between Association and Golf Croquet competitions in the Club calendar.

The Margaret Reid Trophy, a high/low doubles Association Croquet competition was cancelled because of rain in 2012.

A new format was introduced for President's Day in 2012. There has been some discussion that it was not really desirable to have two high/low doubles Association Club competitions in successive months. Therefore we trialled a format where each of the three mallet sports were played, in short forms, on President's Day. This was a success and the Committee recommended that not only it be repeated next year but that the format could be used more frequently.

For the second year in a row, the Blackall Cup, a competition between Canberra and Queanbeyan Clubs has not been held (as at the time of writing). Queanbeyan Club has had difficulties with membership in recent years and has been unable to field a team, although recent contact suggests that a competition may be possible very soon. The Blackall Cup has a significant history having been introduced in 1979 by Dr Blackall's daughter in memory of her father.

Gateballers Glen, Kim and Alex were involved in running the Australian Gateball Championship at the Newcastle National Park Croquet Club in September 2011. There were 26 teams, including several from overseas.

### *All mallet sports catered for*

The Club Calendar reflects our commitment to ensuring that each of the three sports are well entrenched. The new President's Day format celebrated the three mallet sports with great success to the extent that the new Committee might want to explore the possibility of introducing Gateball as a weekday social competition. The Tony Hall Trophy gives prominence to Golf Croquet. The new Honour Boards foreshadowed in the previous Annual Report have been installed, thanks to Peter Freer.

### *Acknowledge member contributions*

Each time I have prepared this report I have commented on the tireless work of a group of volunteers without whom the Club could not function. This year is no different. Every time we raid the biscuit box, wash our hands with soap or have a coffee, we think a quiet thanks to Richard Meacock for keeping us supplied.

Every time we look up the Club calendar on the website or make an online court booking, we say thanks to Ben Freasier, Bob Gingold and Pam Cohen and Jill Jones. Between them, they keep the system running from behind the scenes, reinstall software,

prepare endless reports to the government agency which has given us the computer and manage the website.

Thank heavens Peter Freer is such a genial soul as he also has to deal with greenkeepers as well as members in trying to keep the lawn up to standard. Then there is that little group who push the line marker time after time (and arranged to get it fixed) and another committed group who come several times a week to scout over the lawns on that cute roller.

And every Annual General meeting, when we are told that the fees can remain the same, we can give thanks to Rodney Teakle, a fantastic stalwart and worker for this Club.

Without the income derived from hirings, we would have had to increase our fees significantly over the years. However, almost single handedly Rodney has earned the club over \$5600 this year. Although he managed most of the hirings himself, Peter Freer, Ben Freasier, Bob Gingold, Hilary White and I have helped. In the last two years, hirings has earned the Club almost \$12,000. And as if he didn't have enough to do, he has not only been Vice President but also Coaching Co-ordinator.

There are three jobs in this club which are particularly demanding; Secretary, Treasurer and Captain. The three occupants of these positions over the last two years have been outstanding. Bob Gingold has been a Secretary par excellence. His minutes are speedy and a joy to behold. He has made my job particularly easy. Ben Freasier has learned that the Captain is in charge of everything and will hear every complaint and comment and should be able to fix everything. He has remained cheerful despite the vicissitudes of the position and I am very grateful for the work he has done over the last two years. Tim Goodland keeps the figures churning over and pays the bills which seem to come in with monotonous regularity for such a small organisation. Thank you, Tim.

#### **Membership of other Croquet and Gateball organisations**

Greg Diprose remains Senior Vice President of the Australian Croquet Association (ACA), Tony Hall is Treasurer and Peter Freer is Manager of Events. Tim Murphy is on the ACA Tournaments Committee. Stephen Meatheringham has just stood down as ACA Handicapper but is still on the World Croquet Management Committee and is the official liaison for the World Championships, including the upcoming Women's World

AC Championship in Melbourne (Cairnlea in October). Nerida Taylor was Executive Director of the ACA for a large part of the last year.

Greg reports that the ACA is busy preparing for next year with international events including the inaugural Trans-Tasman Golf Croquet Test series in NZ and World Cup Association Croquet in London.

Gilon Smith remains the National Director of Gateball while Alex Park is also still the NSW Gateball Director.

#### **Promoting the Club and playing disciplines in the ACT**

Bob Gingold, Alan Honey and I participated in the Defence Community Organisation to demonstrate the games and encourage membership. Quite a few children enjoyed themselves but perhaps it was the wrong demographic for our sports. Bob put entries in free advertising for Canberra Day and Australia Day festivities.

#### **Establish links with other clubs in the region**

Bundanoon Croquet Club approached us for a social event during the year and a day of Golf Croquet was organised and conducted by Peter Freer. There was some discussion of a return event which has to eventuate.

Queanbeyan has had membership and subsequent cash flow worries this year. We have had formal discussions with them on how we might be able to help. A significant problem for them apparently is the quality of the lawn. Discussion continues.

Our Club entered teams in NSW Div 1 & Div 3 GC Pennants for the first time. Three teams went to the South Coast Shield at Narooma and various members attended regional tournaments at Young, Walla Walla, Wagga & Bundanoon.

Alex Park reports that the gateballers have been very active in developing the sport in various clubs in NSW, in particular training a school team in Wagga Wagga.

#### **Social Activities**

The Captain has commented that the social side of the club appears to have lost momentum and few people remain at the club after games for conversation. Numbers at the Annual dinner dropped again this year and the Committee should consider whether the dinner responds to member needs in the future. The Christmas party continues to be

well attended. One side effect of the new President's Day format was that people seemed to sit and chat more than usual after the games. However, if Glen Whitehead did not keep chasing us for news and turn out such a classy newsletter, the social side of the Club would be sadly lacking.

#### ***Facility and Asset management***

After last year's flurry of activity in this area, this year has been quiet.

#### ***Lawns Management***

After changing green keepers with monotonous regularity in recent years, the Committee can report that it did not change greenkeepers during the year (although some may have wished we had prior to the Canberra Open.)

The Lawns Manager, Peter Freer, reports that the lawns had a more rigorous than usual renovation last Christmas under our new greenkeepers, Turf Management Australia. Recovery was slowed by very cool weather through December, and a rash decision by TMA to insert turf squares across several lawns, to repair bare patches, just before the Canberra Open, was not well received. The lawns have recovered well now, and although now dormant over winter, are running fast albeit with some issues along some boundaries.

The positive effects of the root barriers installed last year are now appearing, especially on Court 3.

#### ***Advocate and promote excellence***

As usual, the Canberra Club has punched beyond its weight in the high end of the games.

The NSW AC team retained the Fire Cup thanks to a team with a significant number of Canberrans; Stephen Richards, Vice-Captain; Tim Murphy and Charlotte Morgan team members.

We also had four members play in the AC World Championship in Adelaide; Stephen Richards, Charlotte Morgan, Alan Honey and Jonathon Bowen. Tim Murphy had been selected to play but was unable to participate due to ill health. Greg Diprose took over from Tony Hall as Tournament Director while Tony became the Treasurer.

Tim Murphy's program [croquetcortes.com](http://croquetcortes.com) has now been adopted in Australia and probably wider in the world. According to Greg, this is a great step forward as it is designed for tournament managers to enter results as they happen so that players and others can follow the action as it occurs.

Stephen Richards won the NSW AC Bronze Medal. Tony Hall qualified in the 2011 World GC Championship, making it his fifth. Peter Freer was runner-up in the Australian Open GC Singles, and is reserve on the 2012 NSW ISC team. Peter also came third in the NSW GC Champion of Champions competition.

Tim Murphy won the Third Eight Block in the ACA President's Eight. Vic Gleeson was runner up in the ACA GC Hcp. Alan Honey was first, Jonathan Bowen second, and Nick Chapman third in the NSW Selectors 10 event. Tony Hall was a semi-finalist in the NSW Open Singles and Tim Murphy was part of the winning team in the 5 & Under Doubles event.

At the time of writing, Peter Freer was competing in the NSW Beryl Chambers AC event while Alan Honey, Tony Hall & Tim Murphy are playing in the ACA Patron's Trophy. This is only the second time this very select event has been played.

#### ***Governance and Management***

No particular governance or management issues arose during the year.

However, the annual dilemma of having enough members to fulfil our quorum requirements raised its ugly head again. At the early stage of the Committee, with two Committee member vacancies, we were obliged to absorb the members of the Playing Committee into the main committee. Subsequently, two Committee members were able to be co-opted but it would be really nice if people simply put their names forward without having to be begged.

The new Committee should have an interesting year. We have had an agenda item of planning for the Centenary of Canberra for two years and a couple of interesting suggestions have been made for the next Committee to consider. Additionally, next year will be our Club's 85<sup>th</sup> birthday which definitely needs celebrating. Should Margaret Reid remain our Patron, as no doubt she will, in 2013 we will be celebrating her 25 years of patronage.



In conclusion I am happy to say the Club is in a comfortable position with a slowly growing membership base and solid financial foundations. I thank your Committee for its service to the Club this year.

#### Draft Minutes

#### 1. Opening

The President, Elizabeth Mountain, took the chair and opened proceedings at 1.31pm by welcoming members to the 2011 Annual General Meeting of the Canberra Croquet Club (CCC) Incorporated; and inviting their attention to the agenda and associated CCC annual report.

There were 20 financial members present who signed the Attendance Book held at the clubhouse.

#### 2. Apologies

#### 3. Confirmation of Minutes of Meeting held 19 June 2010
